Point of Parliamentary inquiry	Question to the chair regarding parliamentary procedure	None	None
Setting/ Adoption of the agenda	Setting a specific order of the agenda	None	Simple Majority
Setting the speaker's time	Setting or changing the speaker's time for the general debate	1 pro/ 1 con	Simple Majority
Adjournment of the meeting	Closing the session until next year or next conference	None	2/3rd Majority
Appealing the decision of the chair	Overruling a decision of the director/dias	None	Simple Majority
Suspension of the meeting	Suspends the meeting until a later point of time	None	Simple Majority

Closure of debate (Cloture)	Closing the debate on a topic and moving on to voting procedure	2 pro / 2 con	2/3rd Majority
Extension of a caucus	Extends the current caucus	None	Simple Majority

Introduction of an amendment	Introducing an amendment and making it open for discussion	None	None
Request a Panel of Authors	Requesting the authors of a document to answer questions of the committee	None	None
Inviting a representative	Inviting a representative or an expert to the committee	None	Simple Majority
Unmoderated caucus	Suspension of debate for an unmoderated caucus	None	Simple Majority
Moderated Caucus	Suspension of debate for a moderated caucus	None	Simple Majority

Point/Motion	Purpose	Debate	Vote
Vote on Amendments	Vote on the approved amendments for a resolution	None	None
Adoption by Acclamation	Adopt a resolution without voting on it. Only possible when no objections are stated	None	None
Division of the Question	Putting up specific clauses of sets of clauses for a separate vote	2 pro / 2 con	Simple majority
Vote by division of the assembly	Proposed when a majority is unclear. Delegates then are divided into three groups: »in favor«, »abstain«, »against« and are required to walk separately through a door for their vote to count	None	None
Vote clause by clause	Each clause is voted upon separately	None	None
Vote by roll call (equiv. to division of the house)	Voting will be conducted like a roll call, i.e. country-wise	None	None* *can be introduced after a vote as well
